

# ALPINE BIOMASS COMMITTEE

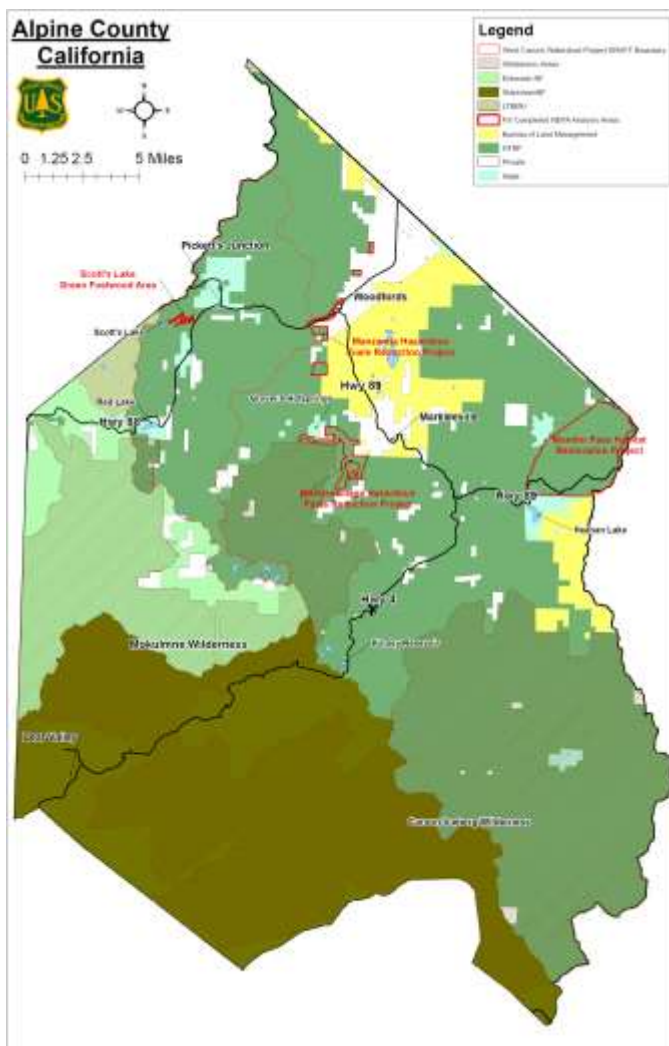
The Alpine Biomass Committee (ABC) aims to unify partners, promote forest and watershed health, and strives for sustainable local economic development for Alpine County. Formed in June 2016, ABC hopes to facilitate its members to maximize their impacts of their projects and to coordinate between different land managers and organizations operating in Alpine County.

Ninety five percent of the county is Federal land which is managed by four National Forests straddling two Regions, and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). Many stakeholders within the committee have completed collaborative projects with one another. While each of these projects has merit on a local scale, to maximize the impact of the available resources it is much better for the

different organizations to collaborate so that each organization's projects compliments the other projects. That way we can have a positive impact at the watershed or landscape scale.

Currently the Alpine Biomass Committee is working on strengthening partnerships and developing a local dialogue based on collaboration. Additional Alpine Biomass partners include:
